2017 was a great year for CAPI.

CAPI's mission is to guide immigrants and refugees in their journey toward self-determination and social equality. In 2017, the agency's 29 staff and 152 volunteers directly impacted more than 5,000 diverse people living primarily in Hennepin County through six core program areas. A key organizational goal was realized in September 2017 when CAPI purchased a 2-story building in



Brooklyn Center and launched a \$1.84 million capital campaign to develop its multiservice Immigrant Opportunity Center in Brooklyn Center (open to the public in May 2018).
